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FOREWORD

Ted Mack, a past Mayor of North Sydney and past Local Member for North Sydney in both the NSW and Federal Parliaments, passed away this week.

He was one of the finest, most principled men I ever had the pleasure of meeting and would be a role model for anyone aspiring to public life. As local Mayor he was active in community affairs, popular with residents, and was highly visible, driving around the Municipality in his vintage Citroen. He famously sold the council Mercedes when he became Mayor in 1980 and used the funds to buy a community bus.

He was an architect and during his time as Mayor acted to limit development where he felt public spaces were compromised.

While he was Mayor I submitted a development application to the Council for an extension to my house. It was approved subject to considerable changes which were beyond my ability to fund. The council officers wouldn't budge on this so I rang Ted Mack and spoke to him personally. He didn't know me at all yet he promised to look into the matter. In fact he organised a conference at my house with the council officer involved and my builder and attended personally. There was much discussion over the plans and he managed to negotiate a compromise which left everyone happy. He helped many others in various ways.

He was not a wealthy man yet resigned from State Parliament a few days before he would have received a million dollar pension, and did the same when he resigned from Federal parliament. He said he didn't need the money and he thought politicians' pensions were outrageously high!

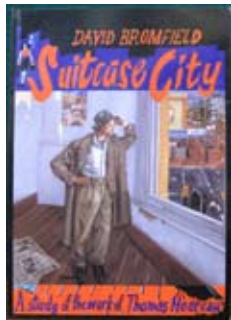
I doubt we'll see his like again. For many years he could be seen lunching regularly with old chums at Blues Point Cafe in McMahons Point.
