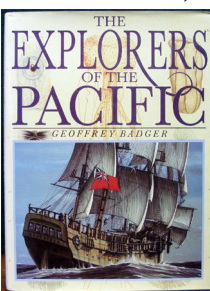


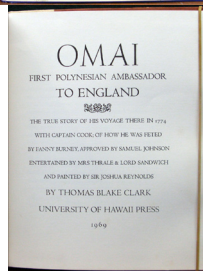

### 25 BADGER, Geoffrey. THE EXPLORERS OF THE PACIFIC.

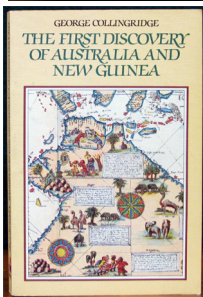

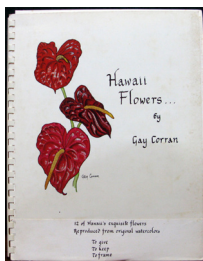
