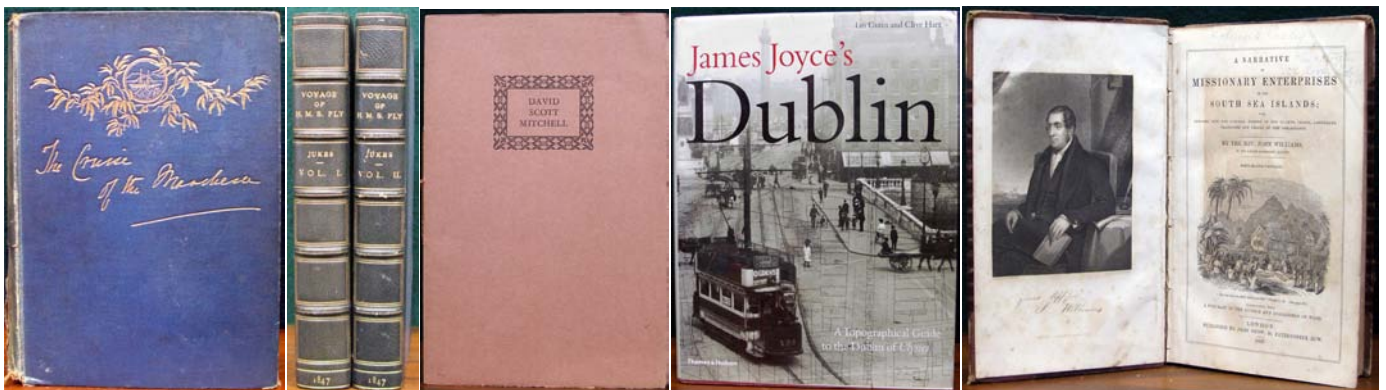

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FOREWORD

Books have always been used as interior decoration items for either aesthetic purposes or to impress visitors when one wants to appear learned.

I had a visit from a restaurateur recently who was intending to open a new restaurant and he had engaged an interior designer to work on the fit-out. He had asked for shelves of books to be part of the set-up, and the designer was keen for the books to be on the shelves in blocks of colour, a row of red covers, followed by blue, green etc. You get the idea, ridiculous though it is. She suggested that he have blank books made with appropriate colour covers because for her the colour was the important thing, and the content of the books was irrelevant. They were just for a colour show after all.

He came to see me because he thought that perhaps I could supply real books with actual content that would satisfy her colour theme. This proved to be difficult in practice because the various colours of the bindings I offered were in different shades of the colours from light to dark and this was unacceptable to the designer. After my wasting a lot of time on this, in the end they went with the blank books.

Probably just as well because he wanted to pay very little for the service! Further to book colours & designers, I had a client who had decided to sell his house and engaged an interiors person to do whatever it is they do to prepare a house for sale, but then he had to go overseas so left her to it. He had a large collection of modern literature, all with dustjackets, arranged in alphabetical order by author on the shelves. When he returned, all the dustjackets had been removed and the books had been re-shelved according to colour. He was distraught, as he never imagined that the person he had engaged would do such a thing. Fortunately she had retained the dustjackets, but it took him days to restore them to their volumes and the shelves to their original order.

I don't understand the point of arranging books by colour, but then I'm not an interior decorator! Please enjoy the catalogue.
