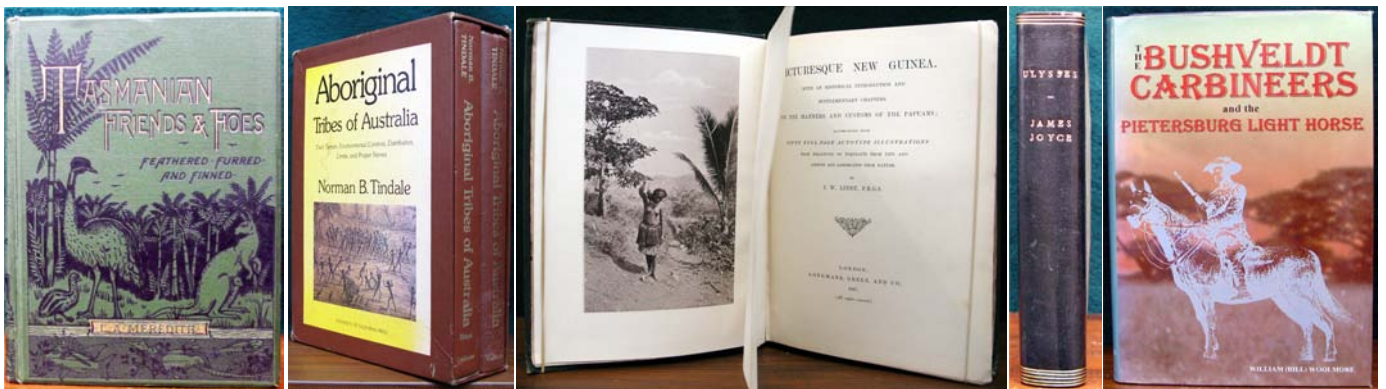
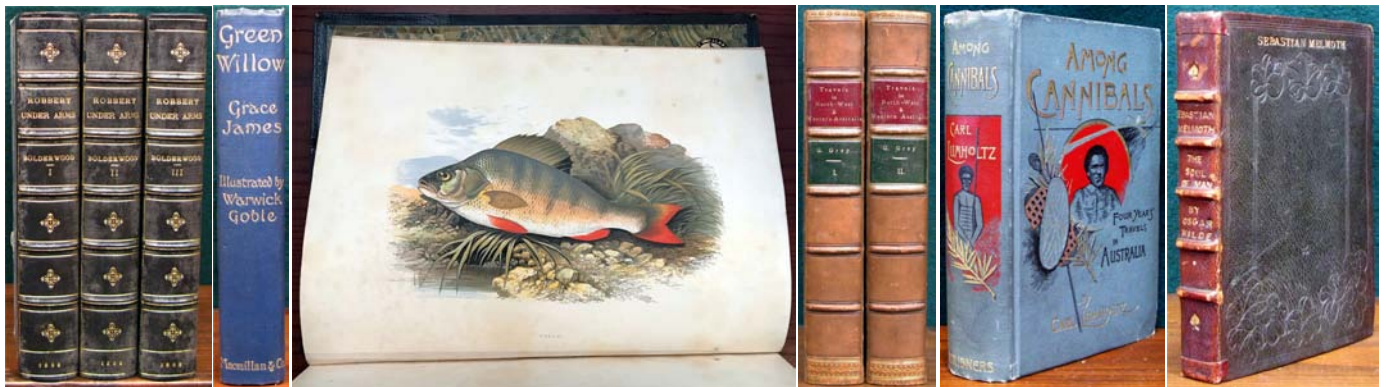

FOREWORD

Australia is a large country and there are many remote towns, particularly in the outback and in the vast interior of Australia.

So I was surprised to hear that the Wolgan Valley, just a little over 100 km from the Sydney CBD is currently almost impossible to reach due to a major landslip that occurred in November last year. The only access road has collapsed following bushfires and rain and a temporary access road is only available to residents and landowners using 4WD vehicles, and additionally with permission to access a locked gate.

The Emirates Wolgan Resort, the first Emirates resort located outside the UAE, is currently closed because of this, and residents and businesses in the valley have faced major challenges in getting to and from the area.

Wolgan Valley is noted for its railway tunnel, called the glow-worm tunnel for obvious reasons, and the former Commonwealth Oil Corporation shale oil mining operations at Newnes. The railway, 51km in length, was built in 1907 and closed in 1932.

Item 217 in this catalogue describes the construction of the railway, which because of the many steep grades, was an amazing engineering feat and required special locomotives which were imported from the USA. The rails were lifted during WWII and shipped to North America for use as anti-tank traps and gun emplacement reinforcements.

Other iron fittings were used as scrap for munitions.

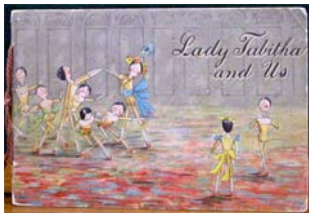
Although it has been said that the access road will be closed for a year, it is likely to be much longer given the estimated costs. Let's hope that it happens sooner than expected.
